This information gives you an overview of where Heilbronn linguistic mediator volunteers offer assistance in your native language during conversations.

You will receive assistance during conversations at:

- » Kindergartens/day care
- » Schools, including parent-teacher conferences/ registration days/school enrolment
- » City of Heilbronn Office for Family, Youth and Senior Citizens (Youth and Social Services)
- » Consultation centres, such as Workers' Welfare Association AWO/Caritas/German Red Cross/Diakonie
- » Credit counselling services
- » Job centres and at the employment agency Agentur für Arbeit
- » Institutions for people with disabilities or their relatives

- » subject to a duty of professional secrecy
- » are not sworn in but are committed to volunteer work

How do I ask for a linguistic mediator?

- » The service is free of charge and applies to all Heilbronn institutions.
- » If you need assistance from interpreters, please contact the institutions (schools, kindergartens, consultation centres, etc.) directly and ask to receive assistance from linguistic mediators during conversations.
- » The institutions will then contact the Participation and Integration division to book a linguistic mediator.
- » You will need to provide the following information: What language/dialect do you speak?
